Bob Lee called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m. with the following members present: Don Holland, Jeri Custer, Randy Allies, Michael Hayworth, Doug Martens, Ed Joiner and Elizabeth T. Ball-Mavity present.

Bob states that COLA is 2.1 percent this year. Bob also reminds everyone that the road department contract states that the employees will be given COLA or if the county approves higher it will receive that rate.

Doug states that he believe MACO is in the process of doing a salary survey state wide and he would like to see where Rosebud County is compared to other counties. He believes we may be in the top third salary range.

Jeri states that the Carbon County Clerk and Recorder makes \$53,795.00 with the additional Election commissioner stipend. Jeri states that several counties have longevity and gives examples of some.

Jeri states that the Sheriff and Deputies are given longevity per Montana Code in every county. Open discussion regarding longevity and Deputies salaries because their pay is based on the elected officials salaries in the County Pay Matrix.

Liz states that a deputy salary discussion was held by e-mail discussion between the Clerks of Courts in the State and Rosebud County falls into the lower third. Doug states that Rosebud County has quite a few more employees then some counties therefore the amount of money being paid in salaries in the counties is different.

Open discussion regarding the elected officials having knowledge and experience in their departments. Doug states that the private sector pays higher salaries and sometimes it is difficult to hire qualified people because of the lower salary offered by the County.

Open discussion regarding the PERS increase that will raise the counties contribution 1% and the employee contribution by 1%. Jeri said the insurance may go up but it will not affect the employee contribution.

Open discussion regarding base salary originally being set by Montana Code by County Class. That is no longer in effect. The Compensation Board was created to replace that system of establishing Elected Official Salaries.

Don states that any increase would have to depend on what the budget could afford. Bob states that an increase would not affect the Rosebud County tax payers. It would come from someplace else in the budget. Bob states that he was thinking of a 2 1/2 to 3 percent for the employees and it may be necessary to tweak the pay matrix. Job descriptions in some departments have been changed and it may need to include different job titles and to have pay adjusted accordingly to compensate for extra duties.

Open discussion regarding longevity and deputies salaries being a percentage of the elected official salary. Don asks about a cap being placed on any longevity that might be considered because it gets down to dollars and cents. Possible options are discussed and may need a proposal to be submitted prior to any decision. Ed states that counties vary so much in size that the salaries may be very different for the amount of work that is required from each department. All agree that a proposal with concrete numbers as to how much a longevity increase might cost the county is necessary with a determined starting date. Michael states that as long as a Uniform Policy is established and approved by the commissioners that longevity could be added.

Open discussion regarding a 4 percent increase for employees would give them a .9 percent increase if COLA is 2.1 and the PERS increase is 1 percent. Open discussion regarding giving the Elected Officials a dollar amount increase and the employees a percentage.

Bob moves that the board raise the elected official's salaries by \$3,000 a year. Jeri seconds the motion. Discussion. Don states that he will be voting nay and explains his reasons. Vote is held and all in favor with one Nay. Motion passes.

Don moves that longevity be looked into after serious consideration of all options and available funds for next years meeting. Bob seconds the motion. All in favor. Motion passes.

Open discussion regarding the County Attorney salary that is based on the Judges. Michael asks for the same \$3000 dollar increase as the rest of the Elected Officials. Doug so moves. Ed seconds. All in favor. Motion passes.

Open discussion regarding Coroner salary. All agree that Jeri should figure out what percent a \$3000 increase would be and add that to his base salary for his raise. Doug so moves. Ed seconds. All in favor. Motion passes.

WHEREAS, Commissioner Martens viewed the site of the proposed abandonment in the company of the County Road Supervisor on May 8, 2013;

WHEREAS, the Commission has determined that public safety and public access will not be reduced by such action and receiving no protest;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Rosebud County Board of County Commissioners abandon and vacate that portion of Cow Creek Road lying between Section 18 and 19, Township 1 North Range 43 East and returns the use of such right-of way to the landowner.
