The Board of County Commissioners of Rosebud County, Montana, met in Regular session on August 13, 2019 at 10:00 a.m. in the Rosebud County Courthouse Commissioners' Office, with Robert E. Lee, Presiding Officer, Douglas D. Martens, Member, Ed Joiner, Member, and Clerk & Recorder, present.

No public comment on any subject not on today's Agenda.

Commissioner Martens motioned to approve the consent agenda, to include all claims. Commissioner Joiner seconds motion; motion carried, 3-0.

Now is the time set to discuss a decision on whether to give a requested tax abatement to the Orion Clearwater Resources wind farm. Public persons present as follows: Marvin Quinlan, Nancy May, Robert Vannattan, Rod Dresbach, Jim Atchison, Pat Zent, and Joe Schiffer.

Commissioner Martens motioned to table the tax abatement decision. Commissioner Joiner seconds motion. Commissioner Lee abstains from voting as previously decided based on a conflict of interest.

Discussion as follows: Commissioner Martens explains that Rosebud County just recently received the Draft Development Agreement from Clearwater Energy Resources LLC, as well as a Road Use Agreement. It is the Commissioners' due diligence that the Agreements need to go through the MACo attorneys before a decision can be made.

Commissioner Martens states that he had a conversation with Michael Cressner, Project Manager of the proposed wind farm, and proposed that Rosebud County charge some sort of impact fee. Commissioner Martens stated that the Road Use Agreement is such that Clearwater will take care of the roads 100% and make sure they are in as good or better condition at the end of the project as they were at the beginning. Clearwater wants to put up a \$2.5 Million bond so that if the roads are not put back to their original or better condition, Rosebud County would then be able to use that bond money to repair the roads. It is Clearwater's intention to hire a company to assess the roads both before the project begins and at the project's completion.

A \$750,000 impact fee has been discussed as well as \$2.5 Million to be paid to Rosebud County over the next 9 years. With the consideration of such an impact fee, the dollar amount comes out to roughly the same with or without giving a tax abatement.

The Commissioners have no implied powers. We can only do what the law allows us to do. So that all needs to be worked out before a decision to give or deny a tax abatement can be made.

Commissioner Martens stated that he met with the AFL-CIO yesterday and they are putting together a possible jobs option where the AFL-CIO would pay half the salary of the wind farm employees and the wind farm would pay the other half. They would use a prevailing wage and would offer training to local residents so that they would be able to obtain those jobs. They also want the wind farm to offer Rosebud County contractors and businesses preference for any required resources. Since 50% of the project will be built in Rosebud County, at least 50% of the services should come from Rosebud County residents/businesses.

We want to send a message to any future developers that Rosebud County is open for business. As well, Commissioner Martens feels bad for the folks living in the Rosebud School District. They are paying much higher taxes. Wind farms are taxed much lower than the coal industry.

Commissioner Martens states that going forward we are basically waiting for the MACo attorneys to give us an answer, but basically feels that the wind farm should pay the same amount they would pay without getting the abatement with the difference being made up in impact fees.

Commissioner Joiner states that the impact fees need to be investigated further and we need to check all the options before a decision can be made.

Commissioner Lee states that he can see some of the impact fees coming to Forsyth.

Pat Zent states he has concerns for the City of Forsyth and it would be nice to know what impacts there will be. Commissioner Martens states he doesn't see any economic impact on the City but there is still a benefit to the tax base.

Bob Vannattan states there will definitely be an impact on the county landfill because at some point it will be full of blades, just like it was in Wyoming. Commissioner Lee states that they will be charged the landfill fees, so many dollars per ton for everything dumped there. Commissioner Martens states that the problem then becomes that the landfill will become full. Bob Vannattan mentions that it will also be filled with toxic chemicals. Commissioner Martens thanks Bob Vannattan for bringing that up and states the Commissioners will look into it and further mentions that that's why we have these public comment periods, is to get input and ideas from the public to bring up things not otherwise thought of.

Commissioner Martens states he does not see there being a huge impact for law enforcement as there should be quality workers that will be climbing 150' towers.

Rod Dresbach states he thought the towers were 250'.

Commissioner Martens states there will be a mix of sizes. As well, if you do a research of federal subsidies, they'll lose 20% per year if the project is not done by 2021. As long as they've got materials, they are qualified.

Nancy May inquires as to the name of the company.

Commissioner Martens states it is Orion.

Jim Atchison states that if other companies are looking at Rosebud County and sees that we are "open for business" it sends a very strong message.

Bob Vannattan states that this is one of the companies that shut Colstrip down – not directly but had a hand in it.

Commissioner Martens states that if in five years Units 3 and 4 shut down, Rosebud County still needs to collect taxes. If we have a \$500 Million wind farm, they will be paying most of the taxes rather than getting passed on to the individual residents. The consumers want green energy.

Bob Vannattan asks "but do you have children and grandchildren that are about to lose their Colstrip jobs? The wind farm is going to kill Colstrip."

Commissioner Lee asks Vannattan, "do you think if the wind farm goes up or doesn't go up it's going to make a difference as far as what happens in Colstrip?"

Bob Vannattan, "No."

Commissioner Martens mentions that a lot of the problems we are having with the wind farm is that they are an out-of-state company and can't read Montana law. The Commissioners only have the authority that the laws allow us to have.

Marvin Quinlan states that of course the company is going to interpret the law so that it works best for their company.

Rod Dresbach asks if the wind farm has their own emergency response team, because we may have to climb a tower, even on the maintenance part of it, to assist someone.

Commissioner Martens states that is a good question and we'll look into that. Commissioner Martens also states that he has been keeping a tally of the incoming comments regarding giving or not giving a tax abatement and it's dead even county-wide. Coal consumption is actually increasing worldwide but not necessarily in the United States.

Bob Vannattan states that since Montana won't work with companies wanting to come into our state with their business, the companies will go elsewhere, such as North Dakota or other states that are willing to work with them.

Commissioner Martens states that the state's share of the taxes is not abated.

Commissioner Lee states that we cannot go outside of Montana Code, and once we give the abatement, we cannot take it away.

Commissioner Martens explains that we would be abating the company value, i.e. if they are a \$500 Million company, then they would go to a \$250 Million company.

Commissioner Lee states that the depreciation schedule is 3% per year until it gets down to 20% of the original costs, then it stays there.

Commissioner Martens explains that it catches up in year 8. Right now, Rosebud County has the lowest tax rate in the state of Montana.

Commissioner Lee states that of the three counties where the wind farm is proposed to be built, Rosebud County has 90 mills, Custer County has 230 mills and Garfield County has 300 mills.

Commissioner Martens states that whatever Rosebud County decides to do, it will not affect Custer or Garfield Counties. Those counties will do what is best for them. We are on a 120-day clock. We are concerned that they have not come up with a project plan yet, and although the Montana Department of Revenue is satisfied, as far as Commissioner Martens is concerned the 120-day clock has not even started yet.

Commissioner Martens states that the control center will be in Angela but that it will not be open 24/7. It will be remotely monitored from out of state but they will have local workers that are able to get to it quickly. Orion wants to train local folks to work the jobs at the wind farm. That is their goal and their hope.

Commissioner Martens states that it is up to us to get the very best deal for Rosebud County, and makes a motion to table the decision on the tax abatement to a later time. Commissioner Joiner seconds motion. Commissioner Lee abstains from the vote. Motion carries, 2-0.

Commissioner Lee thanks everyone for coming in and talking with us one-on-one.

This public hearing ended at 10:50 a.m.

Commissioner Joiner motions to approve Resolution #1048 for a Determination that a Categorical Exclusion for a Business Innovation Center is appropriate. Commissioner Martens seconds motion. Discussion was held. Jim Atchison from SEMDC states that it is common for all grants to go through this step. The study will look at the plan, and Jim Atchison would urge the Commissioners to pass Resolution #1048. Motion carried, 3-0.
