

OFFICE OF THE COUNTY CLERK AND RECORDER, ROSEBUD COUNTY, MONTANA, Held

The Board of County Commissioners of Rosebud County, Montana, met in Regular session on April 2nd, 2024 at 10:00 a.m. in the Rosebud County Courthouse Commissioners' Office, with Ed Joiner, Presiding Officer, Robert E. Lee, Member, Scott Hein, Member, and Clerk & Recorder, present.

No public comments were received as no public was present for the meeting.

Commissioner Hein motioned to approve the consent agenda, to include all claims. Commissioner Lee seconds motion, motion carried, 3-0.

Now is the time for the bid opening for Weed/IT Building Painting Project. Present for the opening was Amy Adler, Rosebud County Weed Coordinator. There were four bids received to paint the building located at 110 S. 12th Ave to include the addition and two sheds. Bids received as follows:

Pro-Fit Construction, Billings MT \$15, 468.00
Wheels Dirt Work, LLC, Ashland MT \$20, 528.10
Lisa Passmore, Baker MT \$8262.00
Blackwell Customs, Billings MT \$26,626.00

Commissioner Lee motioned to table the decision of awarding the bid to ensure insurance documentation could be obtained by all parties. Commissioner Hein seconds motion. Discussion included Amy requesting permission to let the two high bidders know they would not be considered due to cost difference. The two low bids offered the same services to be considered in the award. Motion carried, 3-0.

Commissioner Hein motioned to sign the support letter for MACo regarding Senate Bill 442. Commissioner Lee seconds motion. Discussion included Commissioner Joiner explaining the letter was to the citizens informing them of what is going on with the veto and legislature, urging constituents to watch what their legislators do. Motion carried, 3-0. Letter as follows:

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A LETTER TO THE CITIZENS OF MONTANA

County Commissioners from across Montana appreciate the widespread support that Senate Bill 442 enjoyed throughout its legislative process. Marijuana revenues are new to Montana, and the bill's thoughtful distribution of this higher-than-expected new revenue stream included some funding for county roads.

Bipartisan and impactful legislation backed by such a wide variety of Montanans is a rarity, and we commend Senator Lang and the bill's many proponents for their efforts. Even after Governor Gianforte exercised his right to veto, we were confident the Legislature would overturn it.

The Governor's veto letter made clear his belief that State revenues should solely fund State projects. No Governor in the history of Montana has ever taken such a State-centric position that blatantly disregards the needs of Montanans.

Public infrastructure benefits Montana's economy, the State's revenue, and Montana's citizens and visitors alike. The veto letter stated that SB 442 would create a "slippery slope" by utilizing State funds for local infrastructure. However, Montanans have always benefited from State resources provided to local governments for assisting with bridges, the secondary road system, and access roads to recreational sites, to name a few.

Given that the State relies almost exclusively on federal funding and gas taxes to maintain the State jurisdictional road system, the Governor's position that "what's ours is ours" is ill-informed and inaccurate. It is not how our state has operated in the past and doesn't recognize the fact that ALL Montanans benefit from infrastructure investments, no matter where the money comes from, even the State's General Fund. SB 442 doesn't create a "slippery slope." It provides new dollars to help meet longstanding infrastructure needs.

Governor Gianforte didn't just veto the bill. He tried to invent a new "pocket veto," which was specifically rejected by the framers of our constitution. There is no scenario where a governor's veto cannot be checked by the Legislature, and that check is an important part of Montana's "separation of powers doctrine." If a governor vetoes a bill while the Legislature is in session, the Legislature can override that veto. If the veto comes when the Legislature isn't able to review that action, it is sent to the Secretary of State to poll members of the Legislature. The procedural framework is simple and straightforward. Every governor in Montana has followed this constitutional process. Yet when asked to submit the bill to the Secretary of State for polling, this Governor refused.

The litigation surrounding SB 442 sought to protect the Legislature's authority under the Montana Constitution, a right that was violated by the Executive Branch, which in turn required the Judicial Branch to intervene and mandate the Executive Branch into compliance. Any twisting or spinning of the case is pure political gamesmanship.

The Court Order is clear. Judge Menahan stated, "At the time the Senate voted to adjourn, few if any legislators were aware of the governor's veto. Following adjournment and a request from the bill sponsor, Jacobsen refused to initiate the post session override procedure, claiming she had not received a copy of the governor's veto and a

statement explaining his reasons for doing so. The legislature was thus deprived of an opportunity to override the veto of Senate Bill 442 and draft the policy contained therein into law.”

We respect the right of the Governor to veto legislation. We respect the rules established by the Legislature on how they conduct their business. We respect any legislator’s vote on the poll being conducted on the veto of SB 442. But we do not respect the political spin that when a governor fails to allow the Legislature the opportunity to review his veto action—and the Court is required to compel him to allow the Legislature their constitutional duty—that it somehow justifies a legislator refusing to participate in the poll.

As local elected officials, we take our oaths seriously. We have jobs to do, serving our constituents and our communities. State Senators and Representatives take the same oath and serve the same constituents.


SB 442 was good policy when it passed by a supermajority in both the House and Senate. It was good policy when the Executive exercised his veto authority. It was good policy when the Court ordered the Secretary of State to poll the legislators. And if those legislators evaluate the merits of the bill and vote according to their constituent needs, it will become good policy for the State of Montana.

If legislators decide to play politics and cite claims about “separation of powers” as an excuse to sabotage SB 442, then it is clear that those legislators are more concerned with engaging in political games than they are working to represent you.

The Court ordered the Governor to abide by the separation of powers and respect the role of the Legislature by issuing the veto poll. And as legislators return their ballots on this critical issue, we would urge you to watch carefully to see how your local legislator votes—because a vote to support SB 442 is a vote in the best interests of Montanans, and a vote to let the Governor’s veto stand is proof your local legislator is ignoring you, and just playing politics.



The Board of County Commissioners of Rosebud County, Montana, met in Regular session on April 9th, 2024 at 10:00 a.m. in the Rosebud County Courthouse Commissioners' Office, with Ed Joiner, Presiding Officer, Robert E. Lee, Member, Scott Hein, Member, Amy Adler, Weed Coordinator and Clerk & Recorder, present.

Now is the time for the Public Hearing regarding Vacation and Abandonment of Fillafer/RD 214. Present for the hearing was Royce Ponessa and Russell Ponessa. A petition was received on March 18th, 2024 requesting the county to abandon the road as it is no longer used. Commissioner Hein completed a road investigation with Road Foreman, Grant Larsen on April 1, 2024. Commissioner Hein determined that the road distance from the highway to the gate is approximately 6/10 of a mile with a gate at each end. There are no other landowners adjacent to the road. Royce Ponessa stated during the hearing that the road previously went to a house that is no longer livable and will not be used in the future, he believes there is no need for the county to maintain it.

Commissioner Lee motioned to abandon the section of road which lies in Section 35, Township 11N, Range 44E and revert back to the landowner affected. Commissioner Hein seconds motion, motion carried, 3-0.

Commissioner Lee motioned to approve the consent agenda, to include all claims and to approve the March minutes. Commissioner Hein seconds motion, motion carried, 3-0.

Commissioner Lee motioned to designate 75% of the State Approved SUD Treatment monies to Eastern Montana Mental Health and 25% of the monies to Two Rivers Wellness. Commissioner Hein seconds motion. Discussion ensued regarding Service Provider Designation for State Approved SUD Treatment. Commissioner Lee stated this is something that is done annually and, in the past, we have allocated 100% of the monies to Eastern Montana Mental Health. However, Two Rivers Wellness is now serving patients in Rosebud County as well as making visits to the jail and a reallocation of funds may be appropriate. Discussion included Commissioner Joiner explaining we get quarterly payments for the earmarked alcohol tax, once received Rosebud County will distribute accordingly. Motion carried, 3-0.

Commissioner Hein motioned to table the Resolution for Weed Board for further review. Commissioner Lee seconds motion, Motion carried, 3-0.

Commissioner Lee motioned to approve the Nile Minor Subdivision Review 1 Lot. Commissioner Hein seconds motion. Discussion included Joan Duffield, Clerk and Recorder stating Kim Nile is selling one lot, the taxes are current, the lot has always been used as hired hand housing and is exempt from the planning board because it was an expedited review. Motion carried, 3-0.

Commissioner Lee motioned to remove from table the painting project bid award. Commissioner Hein seconds motion, motion carried, 3-0.

Commissioner Lee motioned to award the painting contract of the Weed Building to Lisa Passmore for the amount of \$8262.00. Commissioner Hein seconds motion. Discussion included Commissioner Joiner stating that we have received the proof of insurance and the references were all positive. The work will be completed and billed out prior to June 30th, 2024. Motion carried, 3-0.

Now is the time for the bid opening for installation of AWOS III P/T and Vertical Lift Pivot Gate for Tillitt and Rick's Field Airports. Present for the bid opening were Nathan Schrot with KLJ Engineering, Brian Schwend, Airport Manager, Tom Clifford, Will Hedrick and Tyler Morrison with Boundary Electric Co. and Brady Gilbert with CEI. Nathan read the bids aloud. Bid sheet as follows:

No public comments were received as no public was present for the meeting.

Commissioner Lee motioned to approve the consent agenda, to include all claims and to approve the renewal of the OTIS Elevator contract. Commissioner Joiner seconds motion, motion carried, 2-0.

Commissioner Lee motioned to award the bid for the Airport AWOS and Lift Gate Project to Boundary Electric Inc. Commissioner Joiner seconds motion. Discussion included Commissioner Joiner stating the Nathan Schrot with KLJ Engineering reviewed the bid and sent his recommendation for award via email. Motion carried, 2-0.

Commissioner Lee motioned to remove from table the Weed Board Resolution. Commissioner Joiner seconds motion, motion carried, 2-0.

Commissioner Lee motioned to approve Resolution 1191, a Resolution Reorganizing the Rosebud County Weed District. Commissioner Joiner seconds motion. Discussion included Commissioner Joiner explaining that the board will be moved from a three-person board to a five-member board. With one resident from each of the new management areas in the county. Current board members will be notified to submit a new letter of interest and seek interest from other management areas. Motion carried, 2-0. Resolution 1191 as follows:

Resolution 1191
Resolution Reorganizing the Rosebud County Weed District

WHEREAS, the Legislature of the State of Montana enacted Sections 7-1-201 through 7-1-203, MCA, allowing the BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS to establish certain administrative boards, districts and commissions by adoption of resolutions; and

WHEREAS, the BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS has determined it is appropriate and desirable to provide the Rosebud County Weed Board with clarification as to the organization, membership, terms, authority, rules and responsibilities of the Rosebud County Weed District Board, setting forth the same pursuant to 7-1-201 through 7-1-203, MCA, and 7-22-2101 through 7-22-2153, MCA; and

WHEREAS, 7-22-2103, MCA authorizes the appointment of a District Weed Board subject to the provisions of 7-1-201 through 7-1-203, MCA.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

#1. The Rosebud County Weed District shall encompass all land located within Rosebud County excluding the Northern Cheyenne Reservation.

#2. The Rosebud County Weed District Board shall consist of:

- a. One member from the management area 1
- b. One member from the management area 2
- c. One member from the management area 3
- d. One member from the management area 4
- e. One member from the management area 5

If no resident from a designated area can be fulfilled then a member at large will be chosen for service.

3. The terms of the Rosebud County Weed District Board members shall commence the 1st day of July. The members shall serve staggered three (3) year terms on the board so that no more than two (2) terms expire in any given year. Pursuant to this resolution, members appointed in 2024 will be appointed for one (1), two (2), and three (3) years of service in order to establish this staggered pattern.

#4. Weed Board members shall be entitled to mileage as set by the Internal Revenue Service and expenses in accordance with established Rosebud County rates for attendance at Board meetings and for conducting official Weed District business to be paid at the rate of \$50.00 per meeting.

#5. Weed Board members shall be landowners and residents of Rosebud County and have demonstrated a commitment to weed management and be willing to attend meetings and other functions related to weed management.

#6. Members must be appointed by the BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS. The Commissioners shall post prospective membership vacancies at least one month prior to filling the vacancy.

#7. The BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS shall maintain a register of appointments which shall include: the date of appointment to the Board, the length of term, the name of the Board, name and term of the presiding officer and other officers of the Board, and the date, time and place of regularly scheduled meetings.

#8. The Weed District Board is hereby assigned the responsibility for the administration of the Weed District as provided by law and shall possess and perform all duties set forth in Title 7, Chapter 22, part 21, MCA, Section 7-22-2109. Powers and duties of board listed as follows:

POWERS AND DUTIES OF BOARD

#1. In addition to any powers or duties established in the resolution creating a District Weed Board, the board may:

- a. Employ a program coordinator and other employees as necessary and provide for their compensation within the guidelines of the Rosebud County Personnel Policy and administered by the Board of Rosebud County Commissioners.
- b. Purchase chemicals, materials and equipment and pay other operational costs that it determines necessary for implementing an effective noxious weed management program. The costs must be paid from the noxious weed fund.
- c. Determine what chemicals, materials, or equipment may be made available to persons controlling weeds on their own land and determine cost for chemicals, materials, or equipment must be paid by person.
- d. Enter into cost share agreements for noxious weed management.
- e. Enter into agreements with the Department of Agriculture for the control and eradication of any new exotic plant species not previously established in the state.
- f. Enter into agreements with commercial applicators, as defined in 80-9-102 MCA, for the control of noxious weeds.
- g. Perform other activities relating to weed management.

#2. The Board shall:

- a. Administer the District's noxious weed management program;
- b. Establish management criteria for noxious weeds on all lands within the district;
- c. Make all reasonable efforts to develop and implement a noxious weed management program covering all land within the district;
- d. Have a Noxious Weed Management Program that is reviewed and approved by the Board every two (2) years;
- e. Implement management standards for noxious weeds as designated by the Montana Department of Agriculture;
- f. Perform other activities authorized by law relating to weed management.

#9. The County Weed District Board will provide for public comment on the County Weed Management Plan.

#10. The Weed District Board shall abide by the Rosebud County Personnel Policy Manual as adopted by the Rosebud County BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS. In order to achieve its mission, goals and objectives, the County retains the exclusive right to exercise the customary functions of management. These include, but are not limited to, the rights to manage and control County buildings, property, grounds, and equipment; to contract out work; to select, hire, promote, assign, layoff, and discipline employees; to determine and change starting times and quitting times; to transfer employees within programs/services to other departments and other classifications; to train employees; to determine and change the size, composition, and qualifications of the workforce; to establish and adopt new policies, rules and regulations; to determine and modify job descriptions and classifications; to establish or change criteria for performance appraisals according to the performance appraisal policy; and to carry out all other ordinary functions of management.

#11. A Majority of the members of the Weed district Board constitutes a quorum for the purpose of conducting business and exercising powers and responsibilities; action may be taken by a majority of members present and voting.

#12. The Weed District Board shall organize by electing one of its members as Chair of the Board and one of its members Vice-Chair.

#13. The date, time, place and agenda of all regular meetings shall be posted 48 hours prior to meeting on the bulletin board located at the Rosebud County Courthouse.

#14. The Weed District Board shall provide for the keeping of written minutes, including final vote on all actions.

#15. A person may be removed from the Weed District Board for cause or by having three (3) consecutive unexcused absences from regularly scheduled meetings, no longer residing in designated area representing, conflicts or incidents which may be deemed adverse to the duties set by the BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS. A Board member serves at the pleasure of the Board of County Commissioners.
